









HE Antimicrobial stewardship

2021: 4.71m deaths associated with bacterial AMR inc 1.14m attributable to bacterial AMR





Figure 2: Deaths attributable and associated with antimicrobial resistance, by detailed age group, for 1990 and 2021 Counterfactuals have distinct x-axes.


- Key stakeholders: DOH, PSI, IPU, UCC

National Antimicrobial Point Prevalence Survey of acute hospitals

- 2024 data collection: Sept 12th Oct 9th
- Data analysis is in progress
- 44 hospitals participated
- 2022:
 - Over 10,000 patients surveyed
 - 4 out of every 10 inpatients on an antimicrobial





He Antibiotic Quality Improvement Initiative for Community **Prescribers: AMRIC and Primary Care Reimbursement**

Service (PCRS)

• 3,000 GPs receive quarterly report on their antibiotic prescribing over a rolling 12 month period

- Comparisons to regional and national rates
- Key message re: prudent antibiotic use in each issue




