The Journey So Far








2023

- Taskforce established July 2023
- Interim report November 2023





- Final report published August 2024
- IOG established September 2024



2025

 IOG put the key enablers in place to facilitate the establishment of the Common Conditions Service

Work of the Pharmacy Taskforce



- Phase 1: Empowering pharmacists to extend prescriptions
 - Recommendations published in November 2023
 - Extension of max validity period from 6 to 12 months in March 2024
- Phase 2: Empowering dependent pharmacist prescribing
 - Recommendations published in August 2024
 - Extension to common conditions prescribing ongoing
- Phase 3: Empowering independent pharmacist prescribing
 - Extension to models of independent pharmacist prescribing across primary and secondary care
