1. Background & Overview



MyHealth@IE Programme

Vision: To enable the sharing of standardised, interoperable digital health records for both healthcare professionals and citizens, nationally and across borders. We aim to enhance the clinician and patient experience to enable improved clinical decision-making and self-management of healthcare.

National Shared Care Record

A digital record of a patient's key healthcare data aggregated from various electronic data sources and settings and presented to clinicians, patients and carers in a secure and structured way.

MyHealth@EU

Enabling exchange of digital health records between EU member states.

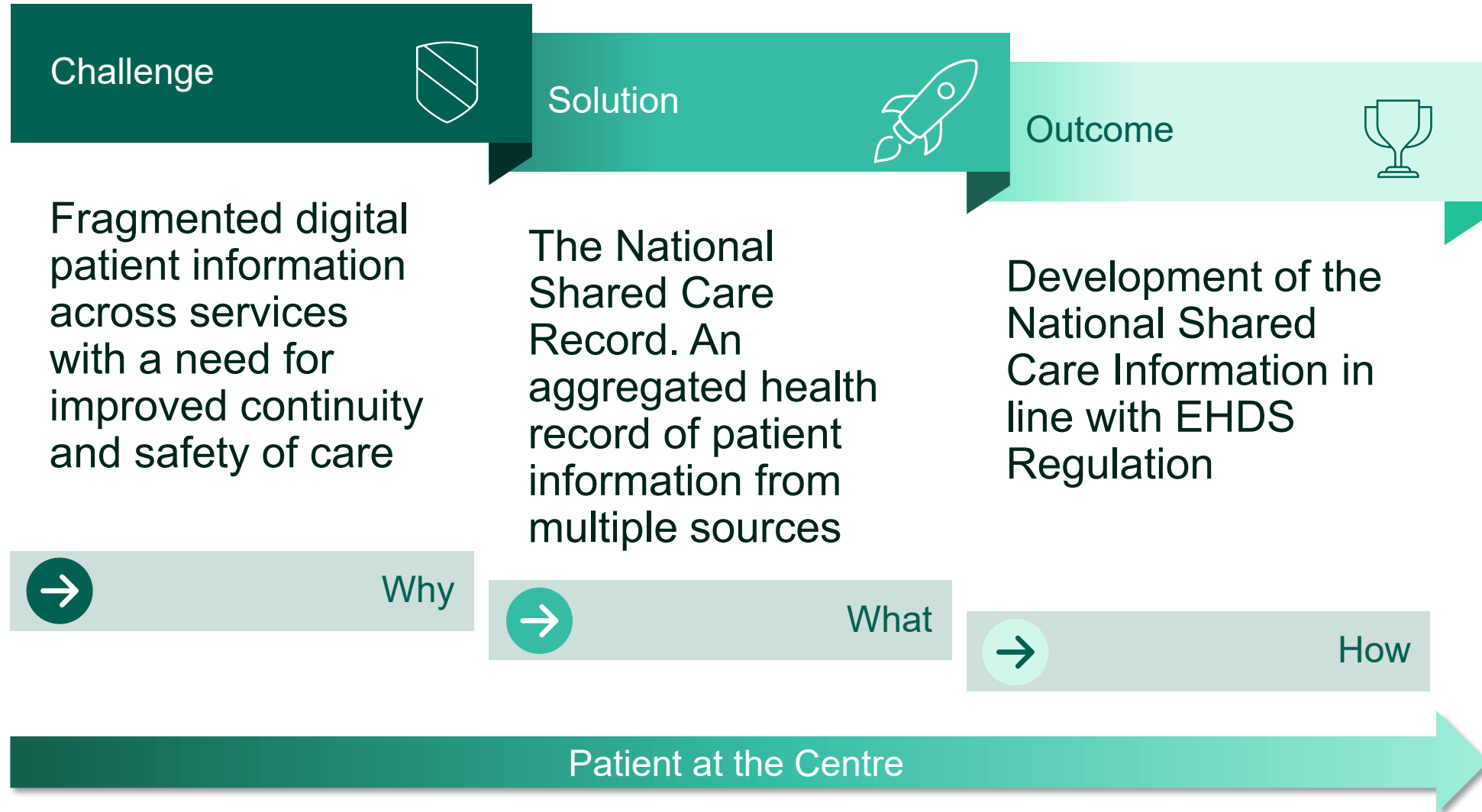

HSE Health App

A secure mobile App to give patients access to their own health information and to make it easier to manage their own health care.

National Shared Care Record (NSCR) Overview (1/2)

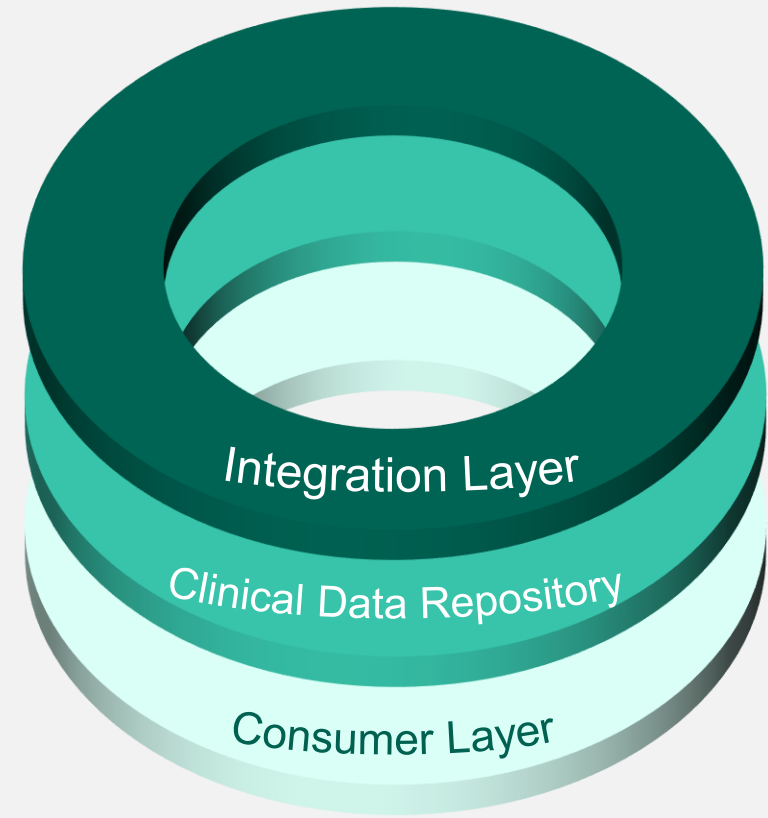


NSCR Overview (2/2)





What is the NSCR?

- A **read-only digital record of a patient's key healthcare data** aggregated from various electronic data sources and settings.
- The NSCR is a **support tool**, not a definitive source, and should be used alongside clinical judgment.
- The NSCR will help **support compliance with the EHDS Regulation**, and to meet Ireland's obligations under the EU Digital Decade.
- The NSCR **is not an Electronic Health Record**. Users are not able to input or edit data on the NSCR.

The NSCR is made up of 3 Components:



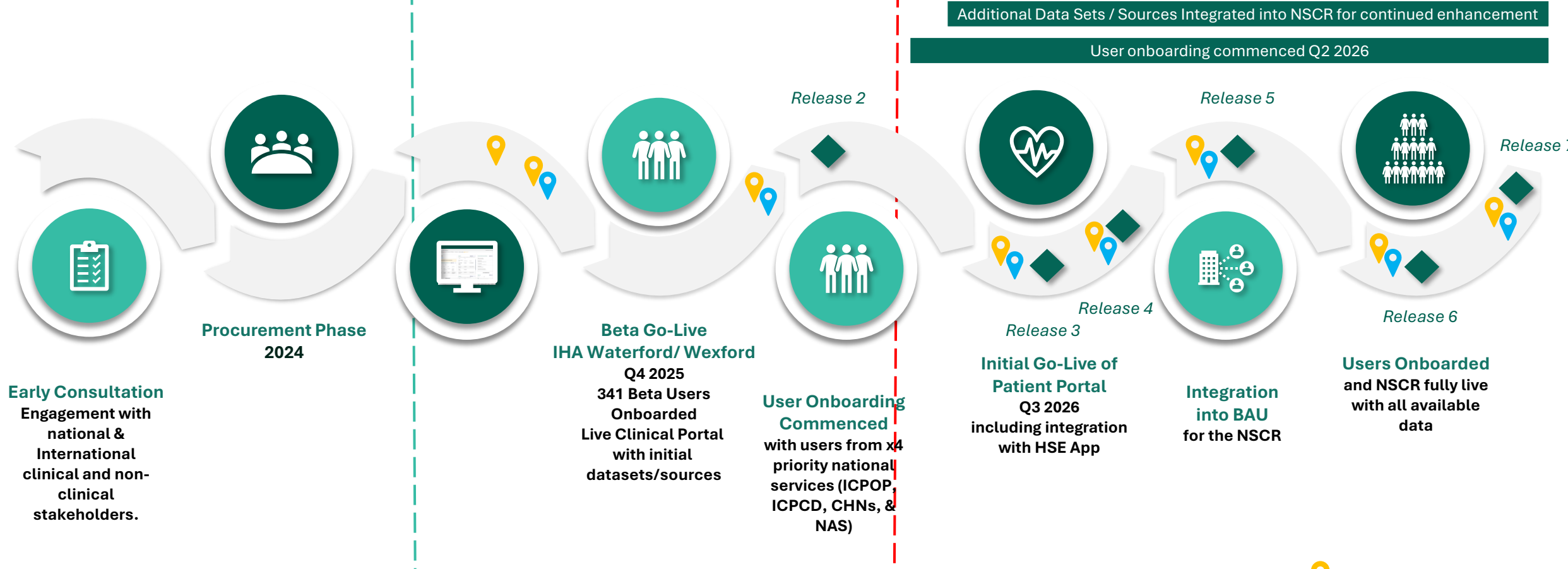

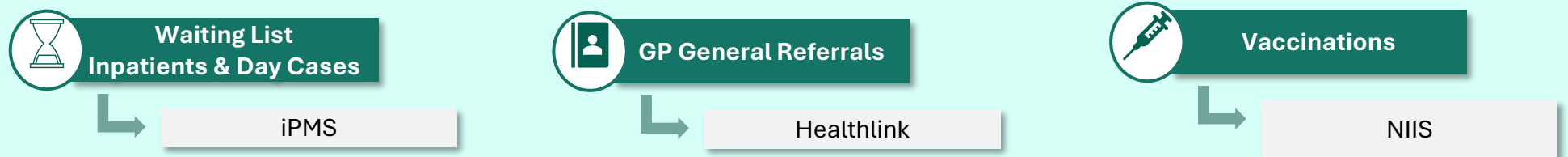

3. What's in it for you?



NSCR Benefits & Perceived Value

Current feedback from users suggests that the NSCR will deliver greatest value when implemented across patient pathways / connected services.

Benefits

1. Improved time released to care
2. Reduced administrative burden
3. Improved clinical decision-making for the delivery of safe patient care
4. Better management of patients with complex needs
5. Improved patient & clinician experience
6. Enhanced capability for hospitals to operate if operational systems are unavailable
7. Improved ability to deliver safe and effective care if clinical & diagnostic systems are unavailable

Core Value Proposition

- Enables **sharing of patient records** across acute, primary and community care settings
- Improves **care continuity**, safety, and decision-making
- Provides a **clear audit trail** of clinical information & healthcare providers

Why It Matters (Outcomes)

- **Improved patient safety** by providing visibility of medications, allergies, discharge summaries, and relevant clinical information – helping pharmacists make safer prescribing and dispensing decisions
- **Enables better clinical decisions** by providing pharmacists with access to key patient information
- Enhances **multidisciplinary collaboration** across settings

Where Value Is Most Evident

- **Chronic Disease:** high volume, repeat interactions
- Patients **transitioning between care settings**
- **Frailty & Older Persons:** high impact (complex, high transitions)

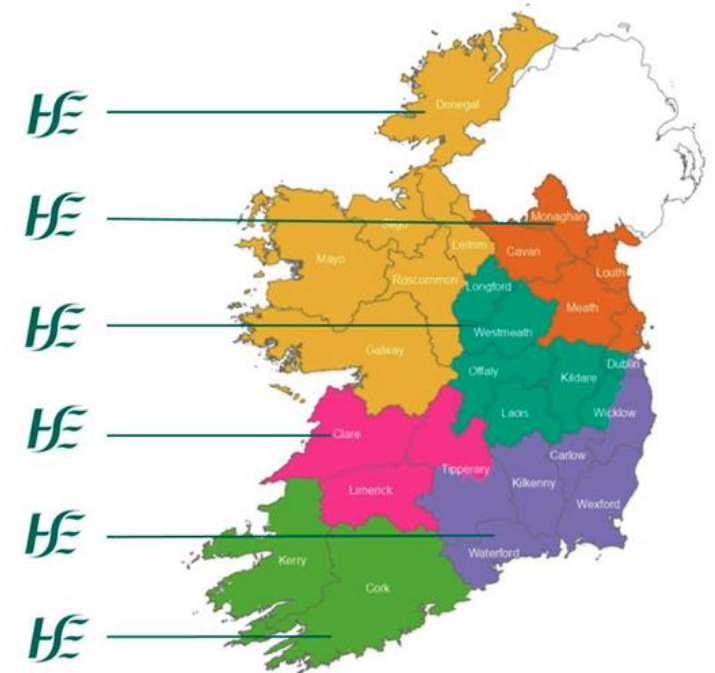

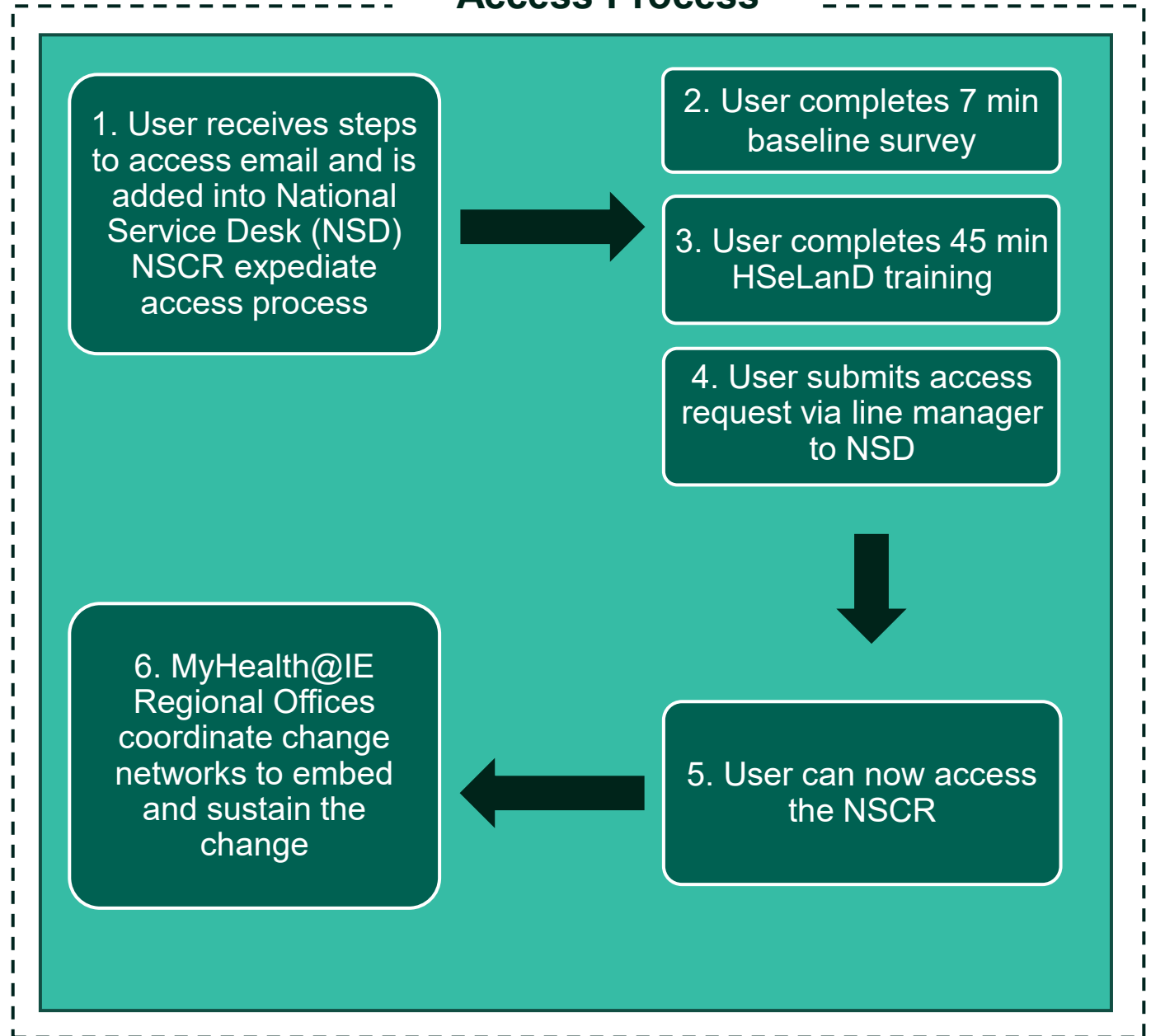


HealthIRL Access Process
