Frequently Asked Questions

What are the benefits of IPU Academy membership?

As a member of IPU Academy, you can participate in the IPU Academy webinars and attend all live learning courses in the IPU Academy Spring Programme. Can I book IPU Academy courses online?

Who is automatically a member of IPU Academy?

How much is the membership subscription for IPU Academy?

The annual subscription fee for 2016 is €100.

When does IPU Academy membership expire?

Membership will expire on 31 December 2016. Membership renewal reminders for 2017 will be sent before membership expires.

Is it more cost-effective to become a member of the IPU?

While it is not necessary to become a member of the IPU to join IPU Academy, membership of IPU Academy is one of many benefits to community pharmacists of IPU membership. The annual Community Employee subscription is €200 + VAT.

Can I become a member of the IPU if I am not a community pharmacist?

No. Membership of the IPU is only available to registered and dispensing chemists and registered druggists, who are registered as community pharmacists with the Pharmaceutical Society of Ireland.

Can I become a member of IPU Academy if I am not a community pharmacist?

Yes. Membership of IPU Academy is available to all registered and dispensing chemists and registered druggists, who are registered as pharmacists with the Pharmaceutical Society of Ireland. Membership of IPU Academy is also available to registered pharmaceutical assistants.

Can registered pharmaceutical assistants attend IPU Academy events?

Yes. Registered pharmaceutical assistants are welcome to join IPU Academy; the subscription fee is €100. This enables you to book a place at IPU Academy events and also receive an attendance certificate.

Alternatively, should you choose not to join IPU Academy, we will be happy to facilitate your attendance at events if there is spare capacity. Please contact the office to establish availability. Please note that attendance certificates will not be issued.

2. Dermatology: Dry Skin and Eczema

Dry skin and eczema are skin conditions that affect all age groups and affect both sexes equally, but usually starts in childhood. There has been a steady increase in the prevalence of these conditions over the past 30 years and they represent a large proportion of the patient queries that community pharmacists deal with in their day to day practice.

The aim of this course is to provide pharmacists with an overview of eczema and dry skin and outline the management and treatment options for these conditions.

3. Schizophrenia – An Update

Schizophrenia is as common in the community as rheumatoid arthritis, with an estimated annual cost of €460 million in Ireland. Up to 10% of patients with schizophrenia die by suicide.

The aim of this course is to provide an outline of schizophrenia, possible causes and treatment options available, along with information and discussion on the role of the community pharmacist in supporting patients to manage their condition.

At the end of this course you will be able to:

- Describe the signs, symptoms, causes and outcomes of schizophrenia
- Outline the pharmacological management of schizophrenia
- Incorporate recovery principles into patient interactions
- Counsel patients and their carers about their medication

4. Sexual Health

Sexually transmitted infections (STIs) present a significant public health problem and are a major cause of acute illness, infertility, long-term disability and death worldwide. In 2013, 12,753 cases of STIs were reported in Ireland; therefore, sexual health is an important aspect to consider for all patients.

The aim of this course is to outline the risk factors, symptoms and treatment for all common STIs as well as provide information on how to reduce the risk of contracting STIs along with an update on emergency contraception.

- · Describe the presentation and management of common sexually transmitted infections
- · Provide advice on how to reduce the risk of contracting sexually transmitted infections
- Discuss the importance of partner notification
- · Advise on emergency contraception

5. Immunosuppression

Immunosuppression can pose a serious health risk to patients. Traditionally, pharmacists would be aware of this issue in post-transplant patients, but nowadays this risk arises in other chronic conditions and as a side-effect of many medicines.

The aim of this course is to provide an overview of immunosuppression, how it can develop and describe the management strategy of both acute and chronic immunosuppression.

- Identify patients groups at risk of immunosuppression
- · Evaluate agents that may cause immunosuppression
- Counsel patients and their carers on the management of acute and chronic immunosuppression
