

Medicines Management in Palliative Care

Once again, the Palliative Medicines Information Services at Our Lady's Hospice and Care Services, is delighted to offer this exciting learning opportunity for pharmacists. Drawing on the principles of palliative care as they apply to the use of medicines, the course provides comprehensive information on the pharmacological management of pain and other common symptoms, an overview of the use of syringe pumps in palliative care and strategies to optimise pharmaceutical care of patients with palliative care needs. This course was developed in collaboration with Trinity College Dublin (TCD) and the Irish Pharmacy Union (IPU).

The course is delivered using an 8 hour online learning training programme followed by an interactive education day, delivered by a multidisciplinary team. Participants will have opportunities to apply learning through the use of case studies, problem solving activities and reflective practice. Registration closes at 5pm on Friday 4th of November 2016.

Course Content

- Gain up-to-date evidence-based knowledge of how and why medicines are used in pain and symptom management in palliative care.
- Understand the practical use and indications for a syringe pump in palliative care.
- Enhance communication skills with patients and colleagues to promote optimum pharmaceutical care of patients at end of life.
